**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
ACCEPTING A \$29,000 DONATION AND AGREEING TO THE TERMS
MANDATED BY THE RED BANK AND SODDY-DAISY CHARITABLE
FOUNDATION.**

Arnold A. Stulce, Chairman of the Red Bank and Soddy-Daisy Charitable Foundation, said it was a pleasure to be able to bring funds to the City to help with the construction of Fire Hall #3. He reminded the Board of the stipulations set forth in the Resolution. The Board thanked Mr. Stulce for the donation of \$29,000 and said the funds are greatly appreciated.

Citizens Participation:

Charles Womble approached the Board requesting permission to move a single wide mobile home on a piece of property on Dallas Hollow Road. The Board questioned City

Attorney Elliott of the requirements to be able to locate a mobile home inside the city limits. City Attorney Elliott said the mobile home had to improve the value of the property by 400%. Mayor Cagle said Public Works Director Steve Grant will need to inspect the mobile home personally and give a recommendation to the Board. She said research will need to be performed as to whether someone can put more than one mobile home on a single lot. City Manager Stulce asked for Mr. Womble's phone number and told him that he would be receiving a call in the morning in regard to the process required.

Amy Neighbors, Allen Elementary, requested use of the Veterans' Park to have their Fall Fund Raiser. She said they would like to have it on November 1st. City Manager Stulce asked the Board if Ms. Neighbors needed to get permission every year to have their annual fund raiser. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to approve and allow Allen Elementary to have their fund raiser annually at the Veterans' Park on the first Saturday in November, seconded by Commissioner Skates and the ayes were unanimous.

Julie Farmer, Filter Specialist Incorporated, requested permission from the Board to have a job fair at Veterans' Park. She said currently they use a temp agency to fill positions but the temp agency pulls applicants from all over Hamilton County. Ms. Farmer said there are many people inside the city limits of Soddy-Daisy looking for work. She said she has reached out to approximately fifteen local employers and half of them need help. Ms. Farmer said having a local job fair should put local residents to work. Commissioner Skates asked when Ms. Farmer would like to have the job fair. Ms. Farmer stated "the sooner the better." She said she would like to have it on a weekday. The Board told Ms. Farmer to call City Hall in the morning to find an available date. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to allow Filter Specialist along with

other local businesses to hold a job fair at Veterans' Park, seconded by Commissioner Skates and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Stulce reminded the Board of the budget workshop on Wednesday, April 16th at 5:00 p.m.

Commissioner Shipley thanked all the City employees. He said, "he had nothing to report on and that means everyone is doing a good job."

Commissioner Skates noted that she saw the Public Works Department using one of the salt spreaders to spread conditioner on the ball fields. She applauded them for making good use of the City's equipment.

Vice-Mayor Nunley stated that the Parks and Recreation Board is in the initial stages of planning a "Pioneer Day" at Poe's Tavern. He said there will be demonstrations of period carving, quilting and other activities that would have been performed during the era of Poe's Tavern. He said the tentative date is May 31st. Vice-Mayor Nunley stated they plan to sell t-shirts to help offset some of the cost.
