**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
TO AMEND THE OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM PLAN,
DEVISE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR A SAFETY
DIRECTOR AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SUCH PROGRAM PLAN. PUBLIC
HEARING AND FIRST READING.**

Mayor Cagle stated this ordinance is a requirement from the State of Tennessee. She said by law the City has to have a safety director which is the City Manager and the plan has to be amended periodically to update it.

Citizens Participation:

Nancy Jo Ogozalek, 10707 Lovell Road, read a flyer from the Soddy-Daisy Food Bank notifying all clients that there has been a change in distribution days and times. Commissioner

Adams stated that the Soddy-Daisy Food Bank provides food for over 400 people a month. He thanked Commissioner Shipley for allowing the Soddy-Daisy Food Bank to use his building and said it was very appreciated.

City Manager Stulce said he needed for the Board to authorize the Mayor to sign the new Tri State Mutual Aid Agreement. He stated that City Attorney Elliott has reviewed it and everything is in order. Vice-Mayor Nunley made a motion to authorize the Mayor to sign the contract, seconded by Commissioner Skates and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Stulce said in the previous commission meeting Commissioner Shipley expressed interest in looking into a public notification system. He said he received information from a company out of Louisville, Kentucky. City Manager Stulce stated the company is Emergency Communications Network and they utilize mobile alerts. He said one of the company's representatives, Kurt Steier, would attend a commission meeting and give a presentation if the Board would like for him to do so. Commissioner Adams said people rely more on technology these days and sirens are not always effective. It was the consensus of the Board for City Manager Stulce to arrange a time for Mr. Steier to give a presentation.

City Manager Stulce said there has been no progress at this time on the City's various transportation projects. He said the City is still waiting on the Federal Highway Administration to allow TDOT to proceed.

Commissioner Skates thanked City Manager Stulce and the staff for their efforts in entertaining Congressman Chuck Fleischmann. She said the meeting went very well.

Vice-Mayor Nunley announced that the Soddy Daisy Kids Club is having open ceremonies for baseball season on Saturday, April 13th at 9:00 a.m. He encouraged everyone to attend.

Vice-Mayor Nunley said the Parks & Recreation Board recommended to the City Commission for there to be no further modifications or additions to Poe's Tavern and the park until those that are underway or planned have been completed. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to accept the Parks & Recreation Board's recommendation for there to be no further modifications or additions to Poe's Tavern and the park until those that are underway or planned have been completed, seconded by Commissioner Skates and the ayes were unanimous.
