NEW BUSINESS:

2017-2018 RESOLUTION NO. 7

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
ADOPTING A CLASSIFICATION AND PAY PLAN FOR CITY EMPLOYEES FOR
FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018.**

Citizens Participation:

Bill Schmid, 10371 Walden Street, thanked the Board for their service. He said there is still an issue at the corner of Walden Street and Card Road with people parking on the road. Mr.

Schmid stated that it blocks the view of other motorists in this area. Public Works Director Steve Grant said he could install more 'No Parking' signs. Commissioner Shipley said he received calls from some unhappy citizens about this same issue. Mr. Schmid stated that there are already signs and they are not obeying them. He asked if there were rules in regard to not parking on the street. City Manager Cagle said there was not but if the City installs more signs and they park there, the police department can write them a ticket. Commissioner Nunley said the City will further investigate and devise a solution.

City Manager Cagle said the Board awarded the fire hydrant bid last meeting to Piping Supply. She stated once Public Works Director Grant informed them that they were awarded the bid, Piping Supply said they bid the wrong sleeves. City Manager Cagle said at that time they withdrew their bid due to the fact that the correct sleeves were approximately \$600 more. She said that Walter A. Wood is now the low bidder and their bid is correct. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to award the fire hydrant bid to Walter A. Wood, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle said the City received bids for police uniforms. She stated that the police department administration developed the specifications. She said the City only received one bid and it was from Summit Uniforms. City Manager Cagle stated that each officer will get a \$600 allowance and Summit Uniforms will keep up with each officer's allowance. Vice-Mayor Adams made a motion to award the bid to Summit Uniforms, seconded by Commissioner Nunley and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle said there is a quote from Motorola for sixteen (16) radios for the fire department in the commissioners' packets. Finance Director Burt Johnson stated the quote is not correct due to Motorola quoting the wrong case. He stated the correct case is \$18 to \$30

higher per case. The Board was asked to approve up to \$106,500 to cover the additional cost. Finance Director Johnson stated the radios will be paid out of the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year Budget from which they were appropriated. Commissioner Nunley made a motion to approve up to \$106,500 for radios for the fire department, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle said there is a quote from Motorola for five (5) mobile and five (5) portable radios for the police department in the commissioners' packets. She stated that she is not 100% sure the quote was prepared correctly since Sergeant Marty Bowman was on vacation and could not verify. City Manager Cagle requested for the Board to approve up to \$34,000 to cover any additional costs that could arise. The Board was informed that these radios were budgeted for the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year Budget as well. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to approve up to \$34,000 for radios for the police department, seconded by Commissioner Nunley and the ayes were unanimous.

Sergeant Jerry Workman introduced newly hired Officer Keith Hindmon to the Board. The Board welcomed Officer Hindmon.

Commissioner Lowe asked if Police Chief Hamrick was home from the hospital. City Manager Cagle stated that he was and if everything went well, he could return to work in three weeks.

Commissioner Shipley asked Public Works Director Grant what he planned to do about the road sinking at the viaduct on Dayton Pike near the Family Dollar. Public Works Director Grant stated that he is trying to find a paving company that will perform small paving jobs. He said he might be able to get Talley Construction to pave it when they are paving Dallas Hollow Road.

Commissioner Shipley said Card Road at Vista Ridge Apartments is in bad shape and is in need of paving as well.

Mayor Cothran announced that the July 4th Celebration is three weeks away. He stated there will be more activities for kids this year.

Mayor Cothran complimented the City's dispatchers. He said he couldn't do what they do day in and day out.
