**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE,
ADOPTING A CLASIFICATION AND PAY PLAN FOR CITY EMPLOYEES
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015-2016.**

Commissioner Shipley stated there was no raise for City employees for fiscal year 2015-2016. He said the Board has given good raises in the past but this year the City has some large obligations to fund two Federal Highway Administration projects. Commissioner Shipley said he appreciates all the City employees for the job they do.

Commissioner Adams stated that the Board agreed in the last budget workshop to review the possibility of giving raises after the bid is received for the Dayton Pike Turn Lane Extension Project.

Commissioner Cothran praised all the City employees. He said he did not like not giving the employees a raise during his first year as commissioner.

Vice-Mayor Skates said the City of Soddy-Daisy has excellent employees and hoped the Board would revisit the idea of giving raises.

Citizens Participation:

Clyde Skiles, 107 Porter Street, questioned if there were plans to hook on to the sewer while the Dayton Pike Turn Lane Extension Project was underway. Commissioner Shipley stated there have been conversations with the WWTA about putting casing in two locations south of Wal-Mart. Commissioner Adams said the WWTA has not made a decision as of yet.

Paul Dodd, 335 Rock Quarry Road, said he appreciated the City for resurfacing his road and stated that they did a good job.

Jinnie Henry, 1445 Bowman Road, said there is confusion with dispatch and some of the police officers about what is inside the city limits and what is not. She stated that she placed a call a while back regarding a tree that had fallen in the road on West Crabtree Road. Ms. Henry said the dispatcher was unsure if this was in the City limits of Soddy-Daisy. City Manager Cagle said she would make sure all the dispatchers and officers review addresses on the City's boundaries so there is no longer any confusion.

City Manager Cagle questioned when camping would be allowed for the July 4th Celebration. It was the consensus of the Board to allow camping from Friday, July 3rd through noon on Monday, July 6th.

City Manager Cagle requested voucher approval to pay Southeastern Materials \$90,820.27 for asphalt. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Cothran and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle requested voucher approval to pay Card's Paving \$9,957 to place asphalt on Rock Quarry Road. Commissioner Cothran made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice-Mayor Skates and the ayes were unanimous.

Commissioner Shipley stated that Priority Waste Services has spent the past several weeks getting ready to assume the City's residential waste collection. He stated that Sean Sims

has been paying people to follow the current service provider's garbage trucks to make sure they are familiar with the routes.

Commissioner Shipley said the Carden family is very appreciative of the flag that was placed at the fishing pier at Soddy Lake.

Commissioner Cothran announced that the Vietnam Veterans Chapter 942 will be holding their annual Fishing Rodeo Saturday, June 6th from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at Soddy Lake behind Regions Bank.

Commissioner Cothran stated that the Vice-President of the Vietnam Veterans Chapter 942 had requested the use of the Veterans Park to have a car show. He said due to a death in the family, they had to postpone the event. Commissioner Cothran requested permission from the Board to use the park on August 29th. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to approve, seconded by Vice-Mayor Skates and the ayes were unanimous.

Mayor Nunley said the Board discussed reinstating City Manager Cagle's 9 year tenure during the last budget workshop. He asked Finance Director Burt Johnson to explain in further detail. Finance Director Johnson said the Board has the option to reinstate City Manager Cagle's 9 year tenure and as part of this, she would accumulate four weeks of annual leave per year. He said they also have the option to give her the extra week of annual leave she would have accumulated if her 9 year tenure had been included when she was rehired in July of 2014. Commissioner Cothran made a motion to reinstate City Manager Cagle's 9 year tenure and to give her the week of annual leave she would have accumulated, seconded by Commissioner Shipley and the ayes were unanimous.
