2016-2017 RESOLUTION NO. 1

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SODDY-DAISY, TENNESSEE, TO ADOPT
AN INTERNAL CONTROL POLICY.**

City Manager Cagle explained this policy is required to be adopted by the State of Tennessee. She stated that it is a written policy for internal controls. She said the City already follows these procedures and “we” have adequate separation of duties in City Hall.

1st - Commissioner Cothran
2nd - Commissioner Adams
Ayes - Unanimous

Citizens Participation:

Kelly Owens, 9215 Springfield Road, stated that there are a lot of vehicles speeding on Springfield Road. She said the amount of cars speeding on her road has increased due to the road project on Dayton Pike. Ms. Owens stated that motorists are not stopping at the stop sign at Springfield Road and West Walden Circle either. Interim Police Chief Jeff Gann said he can perform another study on this road. He said past studies have not shown a speeding issue. Commissioner Shipley suggested putting additional 3-way stops at intersections south of West Walden Circle. He also suggested putting taller rumble strips on Springfield Road. Mayor Nunley requested for Interim Chief Gann to do another study before proceeding with anything else.

Lucinda Belmore with Free to Worship Revival Center requested the use of the Veterans Park on Saturday, September 24th, to host a fund raiser in conjunction with Teen Challenge. Commissioner Cothran made a motion to allow the fundraiser, seconded by Commissioner Shipley and the ayes were unanimous.

Interim Police Chief Jeff Gann presented a quarterly report to the Board. He stated that the statistics show that the City's officers were very busy. He said he was happy to report there were no alcohol related stops during the July 2nd sobriety checkpoint performed by the police department. Interim Police Chief Gann thanked the Board for allowing the festivities for the July 4th Celebration. He thanked the citizens for the fact that there were no arrests during the entire weekend of camping or the celebration itself. Interim Police Chief Gann said every year several outside agencies come together to assist the City in putting on the July 4th Celebration. He said he personally thanked all of them and they thanked the City as well.

City Manager Cagle thanked all the departments for a job well done during the July 4th Celebration.

Commissioner Shipley said he would like to second all of the praises. He thanked Commissioner Cothran and the Vietnam Veterans Chapter 942 for all of their hard work.

Commissioner Cothran said he appreciated all the City's departments for the work they do for the July 4th Celebration. He said he would like to brag on the members of the Vietnam Veterans Chapter 942. Commissioner Cothran stated that there are 100 members in the chapter and approximately 20% are active. He said a couple of members are battling cancer and another just recently had a stent put in but they were at the event all day helping with whatever was needed.

Commissioner Adams said the City has great employees and everyone seems to take ownership in what they do. He said he appreciated living here and working with everyone.

Mayor Nunley noted there were over 200 entries in the car show for this year's celebration.
