The minutes of the regular meeting held December 7, 2017 were approved as presented.

OLD BUSINESS:

None.

NEW BUSINESS:

Certificate of Compliance Renewal – Retail Package Liquor Sales - Marcus Wolff.

Marcus Wolff was present on behalf of the request. The Board was informed that all conditions of the Retail Package Liquor Store Ordinance have been met. Commissioner Lowe made a motion to approve, seconded by Commissioner Shipley and the ayes were unanimous. Mr. Wolff stated his business tries to do their due diligence when selling alcohol to customers. He said he has spoken with Captain Gann and has been informed that DUIs in Soddy-Daisy are almost non-existent. Mr. Wolff stated he tries to give back to the community when possible. He announced that he will be giving a \$1,000 donation from Cork & Flask to the Soddy-Daisy Vietnam Veterans Foundation. Mr. Wolff said there is currently a Bill in the State Senate to allow Sunday sales of liquor. He said he was not in favor of this and questioned if the City could pass an Ordinance to oppose. City Attorney Elliott stated only if the Bill states that cities can choose.

City Attorney Elliott stated the law has been changed since this original Ordinance was passed. He said this amendment makes a few tweaks to reflect the change.

1st - Vice-Mayor Adams
2nd - Commissioner Shipley
Ayes - Unanimous

Citizens Participation:

Tom Slayton, 1222 Peters Road, thanked the Public Works Department for replacing the cross tile near his property. He informed the Board that he has a lot of dirt behind his house that he would like to get rid of and would be willing to give it to the City.

City Manager Cagle stated the City received bids for a patrol car with a “turn key” package. She said that Dodge Chrysler of Columbia was the low bid at a cost of \$34,871. City Manager Cagle stated it was the Police Chief’s recommendation to go with the low bid due to the recent mechanical problems the City has encountered with the Ford Taurus’. Commissioner Shipley made a motion to accept the Police Chief’s recommendation and award the bid to Dodge Chrysler of Columbia, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle stated the City received bids for a police transport van with a “turn key” package. She said the City received a bid on a Ford and a Chevrolet from Mtn. View Emergency Vehicle Services. She stated it was the Police Chief’s recommendation to purchase the Chevrolet Van from Mtn. View Emergency Vehicle Services for a cost of \$32,674. Vice-

Mayor Adams made a motion to accept the Police Chief's recommendation to purchase the Chevrolet Van, seconded by Commissioner Nunley and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle stated that the Fire Chief would like for the Board to declare the 1972 Ford Pierce Fire Truck as surplus. She said the Fire Chief would like to donate it to a smaller fire department. Fire Chief Guffey stated that the truck would not bring much money if auctioned. He stated the fire department has three other reserve engines and this truck is longer needed. Commissioner Nunley made a motion to surplus the truck, seconded by Commissioner Lowe and the ayes were unanimous. Vice-Mayor Adams made a motion to allow the City Manager to donate the fire truck to a fire department at her discretion, seconded by Commissioner Shipley and the ayes were unanimous.

City Manager Cagle announced that Ivy Academy was having a Groundbreaking Ceremony on Friday, January 19th at 1:00 p.m. and has invited the Board to attend.

City Manager Cagle thanked the Public Works Department for a job well done in keeping the roads passable during the recent winter weather.

Commissioner Nunley stated that the Soddy, Daisy & Montlake Historical Association is holding their 3rd Annual History Fair at Soddy-Daisy High School from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 20th.

Commissioner Shipley reminded everyone of the fundraiser for the Soddy-Daisy Vietnam Veterans Association on Tuesday, January 23rd at 6:30 p.m. at Charlie's Restaurant & Lounge. He said 250 tickets have been sold for the event. Commissioner Shipley stated that Congressman Chuck Fleischmann will be the guest speaker and the entertainment will be provided by Stefanie Wittler Beavers.

Mayor Cothran thanked the citizens for purchasing tickets to the fundraiser.

Mayor Cothran commended Sergeant Mike Brown for going above and beyond his duty recently when helping a man, who was going to commit suicide, providing assistance with checking him into a facility to seek help. Mayor Cothran stated that the man sent him an e-mail thanking Sergeant Brown.
